- State guidance was released today regarding the re-opening of Senior Centers. Limited in-person activities and programming may begin to resume, subject to state restrictions, as soon as September 1<sup>st</sup>. Monroe's Senior Center Director will be working with the rest of our Emergency Management Team to evaluate the requirements and will communicate further details with our Senior Center members next week.

- Reminders on certain other state rules that remain in effect:
  - Private social gatherings remain limited to 25 indoors and 100 outdoors.
  - Outdoor organized events limited to 500 people with 15 feet of space "blanket to blanket."
