### COVID-19 Pandemic Update March 12, 2021

#### CASE RATE UPDATE

- Our 2-week rolling case rate in Monroe had a slight uptick, now averaging just over 3 new cases per day – which puts us back in the “red alert” category, along with most of Fairfield County.
- Our 2-week case rate remains at 16.5 cases per 100,000 population.
- As of yesterday’s report, Monroe has had 1,114 cases, and 13 deaths, since the start of the pandemic.

#### VACCINATION

- 23% of Monroe’s population has received at least one vaccination. The statewide rate is currently 22%.
- Please continue to check the links on the Town’s website for vaccination options in our area, which continue to expand.
- We will continue to post our vaccination “standby” list each Monday morning between 8:00-8:30. You must be eligible & registered in VAMS. Visit [www.MonroeCT.org/COVID-19](http://www.MonroeCT.org/COVID-19) for more information.

#### TEST SITE

- In addition to daily testing conducted by our local urgent care centers, the drive-through testing on Wednesday March 17<sup>th</sup>, and continuing every other Wednesday, will be located at the Stevenson Fire Station at 1260 Monroe Turnpike.
