COVID-19 Pandemic Update

April 16, 2021

CASE RATE UPDATE

- Monroe's 2-week rolling case rate has gone down slightly, now at averaging approximately 5½ new cases per day.
- Our 2-week case remains at 28.6 cases per 100,000 population.
- As of yesterday's report, Monroe has had 1,324 cases, and 14 deaths, since the start of the pandemic.

VACCINATION

- Over 56% of Monroe's population has now received at least one vaccination. The state rate is currently just under 49%.
- Monroe's weekly vaccination clinics continue, and there are currently appointments available in VAMS for our Moderna clinic on Wednesday 4/21 at St. Jude School.
- A reminder that Monroe residents that are homebound, meaning physically or medically unable to leave their home, may contact the Senior Center at 203-452-2815 for assistance in registering for our homebound mobile vaccination service.

LIBRARY HOURS

- Starting Monday, we will continue to expand our overall Library hours by 20%, which includes added hours in the evening and Saturdays. Details will be posted on the Library website www.ewml.org. Of course, please remember that social distancing and mask requirements remain, regardless of vaccination status.
